In the spring of 2011, Steve and Lori broke ground for their new milking facility, with the first milking taking place on August 15th, 2011. The 94' x 168' cross ventilated warm, 5-row free stall barn sits atop an 110' x 132' x 12' slatted floor underbarn manure storage system. This system stores approximately 1.2 million gallons of manure. The cows are kept comfortable on a patented dual chamber waterbed. Two (2) robotic milking units milk the

Safe Rooms Save Lives: Federal Alliance for Safe Homes® and the National Storm Shelter Association Spread the Word at 'Rebuilding Henryville' and Donate Nine Safe Rooms to Indiana Tornado Victims *Safe rooms valued at \$70,000 are part of Habitat for Humanity rebuilding projects*

(Louisville, KY, May 16, 2012) - In an effort to spread the word nationwide that "safe rooms save lives," the [Federal Alliance for Safe Homes](#) (FLASH®) has teamed up with the [National Storm Shelter Association](#) (NSSA) to attend the [Rebuilding Henryville](#) benefit concert, and to donate nine safe rooms to Habitat for Humanity for rebuilding projects in the Henryville, IN area.

The Rebuilding Henryville concert held May 16, 2012, featured Grammy-award winning country music group Lady Antebellum and directly benefited Henryville, Indiana which was affected by a devastating EF-4 tornado in early March 2012.

"Our thanks go to Lady Antebellum for their efforts to raise funds toward Rebuilding Henryville and for graciously allowing FLASH and NSSA to educate their fans about the importance of tornado safe rooms at the concert," said Leslie Chapman-Henderson, President and CEO of FLASH. "Also, we are extremely proud to partner with NSSA and Habitat for Humanity to distribute life-

saving safe rooms to tornado victims in the Henryville area," she added.

According to FLASH, a safe room can provide ultimate life safety protection from the dangerous forces of severe winds and tornadoes. Safe rooms that meet NSSA, International Code Council (ICC) and Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) standards are designed to withstand up to 250 mile-per-hour winds, and offer lifesaving refuge for families in the path of high-wind events like tornadoes.
